Job Type: Seasonal/On-Call

Start Date: Mid-November to Mid-April (weather and snow dependent)

Work Schedule: 3 to 5 scheduled night shifts per week (10 hrs +/- per shift)

Reporting to the General Manager, the ideal candidate will be required to safely operate grooming equipment and carry out tasks to build and maintain a high-quality product for our snowmobilers.

Job Responsibilities:

- Safely operate grooming equipment, completing pre and post trip inspections of machinery, and recording the results for review by Operations Manager.
- Perform daily light maintenance on vehicles and implements (topping up fluids, cleaning interior and exterior, greasing, and fueling of machine).
- Recognize and report unusual noises and conditions to the Operations Manager immediately upon first indication of concern.
- Complete daily vehicle log sheets and daily data input form and submit forms via photo text message to the Operations Manager *immediately following* your shift.
- Record and report any potential hazards.
- Report defects, accidents, or damage to equipment
- Transport supplies to and from emergency shelter cabins (including removing garbage and recyclables from cabins and basic cleaning during each shift)
- Relay grooming information to staff for the daily grooming report via text message to the Operations Manager immediately following your shift.
- Be an advocate for health and safety, ensuring a clean and safe working environment.
- Work flexible shifts, including holidays, and weekends, in extreme weather conditions.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Job Requirements:

- Strong problem-solving skills
- Self motivated
- Work well in a team as well as independently
- Must be in excellent physical condition, heavy lifting and manual labor may be required.
- Knowledge of the Eagle Valley Snowmobile Club trail network is an asset.

Qualifications:

- Have previous experience operating snow grooming equipment, with an excellent safety record.
- Are mechanically inclined, with an understanding of basic operations and maintenance of equipment.
- Must be responsible, and reliable, and able to work through the night. Trails are grooming shifts occur between 5pm and 4am.
- A passion for working outdoors.

- Valid BC Driver's license (or international equivalent); previous winter driving experience; a driver's abstract and/or a claims experience letter from a previous insurer stating 3 years claims-free (obtained before commencing)

Wage:

Starting wage to be negotiated within the medians of \$22/hr and \$27.00/hr based on knowledge and skills. Groomer operators will be paid on-call wages of 3 hours per scheduled day if a shift is not required. The EVSC grooms based on snowmobile traffic, and grooming shifts are completed based on a 75-rider minimum.
